An organiser's challenge with unexpected winners

This year's Vasaloppet victors offered two performances that stood out beyond the ordinary. Which of us seasoned veterans would have guessed that an 18-year-old would win the men's race, and that a highly skilled long-distance rookie would cross the finish line first in the women's race? Haven't we often said that Vasaloppet demands a lot of experience to come out on top? On Vasaloppet Sunday, the opposite was proven. Hats off to **Alvar Myhlback**, the youngest male winner ever – and very close to the record time, too. Alvar skied smartly and then sprinted past a very experienced lead group to the crowd's delight. Not quite as sensational, but still unexpected, was **Stina Nilsson's** dominant win in the women's class, gliding under the finish portal with time to spare. Fantastic performances from both.

36 new veterans

During Vasaloppet's Winter Week 2025, 36 new members joined Vasaloppet's Veteran Club, all having completed their 30th race. Sixteen completed their 40th race – two of whom are women. Four veterans completed their 50th race.

New 50-race finishers

Karl-Erik Andersson (KEA), with help from Tore Södersten, welcomed the new 50-race veterans. There are now a total of 65 who have completed 50 races or more. Lars Janlöv from Mariehamn finished in 5:24 and has an average time of 5:25 across his first 49 races – an unbeatable stat, according to KEA. Lars Ruberg, IFK Mora SK, from Lerum finished in 10:26, and Erwin Apitzsch, Lugi SK, from Lund finished in 12:15. Erwin was initially pulled off the track, but after getting his chip back, he picked up the pace and finished well within the time limit. Börje Enander, Ulricehamns IF, from Ulricehamn, completed his 50th race together with his two sons in a time of 6:47.

New veterans

New veteran in the elite group – PO Svahn skied strongly all day and finished 147th with a time of 4:00:26. That's seven seconds within the elite qualifying limit, while also earning his orange number bib for 2026. Peo placed 15th in Vasaloppet in 2007, but many of us veterans might say this year's performance is even more impressive. He skied Öppet Spår in 1994 in 5:36, and has since done every Vasaloppet except in 2016 and 2021. He's placed in the top 100 a total of 23 times, including 10 in the 15th–28th range. He has skied 30 races under five hours, with five races under four hours – best time 3:50:27.

Ulf Nordström also showed positive form in his 30th race, climbing the rankings and finishing in 268th place with a time of 4:15:13. Fantastic performances by these new members of the Veteran Club.

Fastest among the veterans were: Anders Sörensson, 286th, 4:16:40 and Fredrik Sätter, 288th, both equally matched during their race. Tommy Larsson came 361st, 4:23:54, Bernt Niva was 373rd, 4:24:45, and Ronnie Löf was in 539th place, clocking in at 4:35:31.

The Veteran Club's three teams in Stafettvasan

In the women's team, the following skied (in order): 1077 Helén Östensson, 883 Margareta Östensson Lindblom, 928 Carina Johansson, 1074 Carina Hammarstrand, and 1064 Inger Olsson. These five women skied to Mora with the second-fastest time ever for an all-women's veteran team – 8:10:08. (The record time of 7:53:30 from 2022 still stands for now.)

More “veteran joy” came from one of the two men's teams, which skied to Mora in a new record time for a Vasaloppet veteran team. The previous record, set in 2015, was 6:34:14. But Vasaloppet veterans 1109 Martin Eriksson, 778 Jan-Ivar Volödegård, 1233 Mats Liss, 986 Jonny Birgersson, and 771 Rolf Fagerström pushed hard and finished in 6:14:44, breaking the 2015 record (6.34:14) by about 20 minutes. The other men's team had more trouble, with a malfunctioning ski binding, but the affected skier, 866 Hans Wiberg, handled the mishap with good humour and the team completed the race!

Arne Sundquist, who has served as our own “national team coach” for several years and managed the veteran teams in Stafettvasan with great success, is now handing over the responsibility to Margareta Östensson Lindblom, veteran 883, and Helén Östensson, veteran 1077. If you are interested in participating, you can already register your interest so we can hopefully put together three teams for 2026.

VETERANTINGET 2025

86 veterans took part in the Veterantinget meeting on Saturday, March 2, at Andreasgården. The day began with lunch before the formal gathering got underway. Johan Eriksson, CEO of Vasaloppet, spoke about future challenges related to infrastructure and new target groups, as well as the positive

impact on public health – now measurable in monetary terms. He presented research results with great enthusiasm, showing that skiing truly makes people happy. One piece of evidence: just before the gathering, veteran 839 Torleif Bakke welcomed his friend and Vasaloppet legend, veteran 77 Gösta Lönnelid, at the finish line after Vasaloppet 10, which Gösta described as a “short stroll” – understandable for someone with 61 completed races, more than anyone else.

One of Vasaloppet’s greatest skiers has crossed the finish line

Bol Bengt Eriksson has passed away – one of the greatest Vasaloppet skiers of all time has completed his final race. Born and raised in Transtrand before moving to Älvdalen, Bengt passed away at the age of 94. He became the first skier ever to complete 60 races. That feat alone is impressive, but Bengt’s average time and finishing record across those 60 races is also unlikely to be surpassed. His best placement was second in 1958, and his average time across all 60 races was an incredible 5 hours and 21 minutes.

Summer Week 2025

The first weekend of the Summer Week 2025 (August 8–9) is all about cycling. It begins Friday morning with Cykelvasan Öppet Spår from Sälen and Ungdomscykelvasan from Oxberg. In the afternoon, Cykelvasan 30 and Cykelvasan 45 start in Oxberg. On Saturday, the main race Cykelvasan 90 takes place, starting from the classic Vasaloppet start in Berga by, Sälen.

The second weekend (August 15–16) is dedicated to running. On Friday, Trailvasan 10 will take place with start and finish in Mora. On Saturday, one relay and three individual races are held. Vasastafetten, with ten legs between 4.5 and 15 km, starts in Sälen. The prestigious Ultravasans 90 also starts in Sälen, at 05:00, while the shorter version, Ultravasans 45, starts in Oxberg. Trailvasan 30 also starts in Oxberg.

Register for the Summer Week 2025

Vasaloppet offers members of the Veteran Club a 20% discount on all summer events, except for Cykelvasan 90.
